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### What is this product?

Investment Company (SICAV), Luxembourg

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the board of directors may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

### **Objectives**

The sub-fund aims to make sustainable investments and achieve a better return than its benchmark defined as OMRX T-Bill index (the "Benchmark"). In order to achieve its objective, the sub-fund allocates its investments between different segments of the interest markets. The main category of financial instruments are interest bearing instruments such as bonds and money market instruments issued by governments and their agencies, state and municipal entities, banks, corporation and companies that are domiciled or active in Sweden, Finland, Norway. Denmark and Iceland.

The sub-fund may invest directly in interest bearing instruments and may also invest in derivatives to achieve its investment objective or to mitigate risks. The sub-fund may also invest up to 10% of its assets in other funds. sub-fund qualifies as an Article 9 financial product under SFDR. The sub-fund has sustainable investments as its objective. The sub-fund's five thematic sustainable investment objectives are linked to the Sustainable Development Goals (the "SDGs"), which contain a wide range of environmental, social and governance goals such as climate action, decent work and economic growth, responsible consumption and production, good health and well-being, peace and justice, sustainable cities and commodities etc.

The Investment Manager integrates these goals into the sub-fund's investment strategy to better manage risk, generate sustainable long-term returns, and promote environmental or social characteristics. The Investment Manager uses negative screening of assets for exclusion from the investment universe. Benchmark: The portfolio is actively managed on a discretionary basis without reference to a benchmark. However, the sub-fund is managed in reference to the OMRX T-Bill Index for the purpose of marketing only.

### Intended retail investor

The sub-fund is offered to investors who may have basic or no knowledge and experience of investing in financial markets and also experienced investors and is intended for investors looking for a return that exceeds the benchmark while reducing the likelihood of capital losses on a medium term basis through a flexible diversified fixed income portfolio. Since the sub-fund is focused on a bond universe rather than on cash volatility, investors should have an investment horizon of at least five years.

### Other information

Depositary: Skandinaviska Enskilda Banken. AB (publ) - Luxembourg Branch

Dividend income: This class is a capitalisation class meaning that income is reinvested.

Conversion right: The investor has the right to convert his investment in shares in one sub-fund for shares in the same sub-fund or in another sub-fund. The investor can obtain information about how to convert in the prospectus of the fund.

Segregation: The assets and liabilities of a sub-fund are segregated pursuant to the law so that the commitments and liabilities of one sub-fund do not affect the other sub-funds.



The reference currency of the sub-fund is expressed in SEK. The currency of the share class is expressed in NOK. For this share class, the foreign-exchange risk of the share currency is systematically hedged against the sub-fund's reference currency.

### What are the risks and what could I get in return?

#### Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

**Be aware of currency risk.** You may receive payments in a currency that differs from your reference currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

## What happens if FundRock Management Company S.A. is unable to pay out?

### Costs over time

### Recommended holding period: 5 years
