What is this product?

Type

Investment Company (SICAV), Luxembourg

Term

This sub-fund has no maturity date. However, the manufacturer may decide to close the sub-fund under certain circumstances.

Objectives

The sub-fund aims to achieve the highest possible return, relative to the risk taken by the sub-fund.

The sub-fund invests in fixed income and fixed income related securities issued by corporations, agencies, governments and municipalities. The securities primarily include corporate bonds, but also subordinated and covered bonds. Investments are expected to give the sub-fund a higher risk and return than traditional interest-bearing securities.

The sub-fund qualifies as an Article 9 product under SFDR since its investment strategy contains ESG objectives.

The sub-fund's investment objective is to create long-term positive return relative to its risk profile, by investing in companies enabling the sub-fund to maintain a decarbonization trajectory. All of the sub-fund's investments are subject to strict exclusion criteria limiting the sub-fund's investment universe not to include among others holding companies that generate a significant amount of Green Gas Emissions contributing to accelerate global warming and temperature rising as such investments do not contribute to the sustainable objective of the sub-fund. The sub-fund's inclusion criteria further limit the sub-fund's investment universe by establishing criteria that the holding companies must comply with in order to be eligible for investment. Some inclusion criteria are made to specifically ensure that the holding companies are able to have a long-term positive impact on the Sub-Fund's sustainable investment objective.

The sub-fund will not make investments which constitute an unacceptable risk that we may contribute to unethical acts or omissions. In addition, the sub-fund must comply with the requirements of the Nordic Swan Ecolabel and will pick companies based on the positive inclusion criteria. The sub-fund has a global investment universe, but invests predominantly in developed markets.

The average duration shall be between 0 and 7 years.

The sub-fund may use financial derivative instruments (FDI's), such as forward rate agreements, futures, options, swaps, CDS (Credit Default Swaps) and other derivatives for both hedging and investment purposes.

Benchmark: The portfolio is actively managed on a discretionary basis without

reference to a benchmark.

Intended retail investor

This product may be appropriate for all investors who want to assume credit and interest free risks, seek capital appreciation and are willing to take on the increased risk associated with the investment. This product may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 3 years.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You may receive payments in a currency that differs from your reference currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

The sub-fund is also exposed to the following materially relevant risks that are not included in the summary risk indicator: Credit risk, Liquidity risk, Currency risk, Derivative risk, Counterparty risk, Operational risk, Sustainability risk.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

What happens if FundRock Management Company S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is responsible for administration and management of the sub-fund, and does not typically hold assets of the sub-fund (assets that can be held by a depositary are, in line with applicable regulations, held with a depositary in its custody network). The Management Company, as the PRIIPS manufacturer has no obligation to pay out since the product design does not contemplate any such payment being made. However, investors may suffer loss if the sub-fund or the depositary is unable to pay out. There is no compensation or guarantee scheme in place which may offset, all or any, of this loss.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding period we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario
- 100.000 NOK is invested

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 3 years
